

Character Areas

2. Mews Streets and Greenways

Mews streets are generally narrower and more intimate with limited parking to the street and, in cases of small greenways, no vehicular access. Parking is located to the rear of properties in small parking courts.

Mews streets feature terraces of 2 or 3 units, with a mix of 2 storey mews houses and 3 storey townhouses.

Mews houses will have a brick base using either a rusticated brick or a contrasting brick banding detail. First floors will be brickwork with variation to the street scene introduced through the selective use of vertical black boarding.

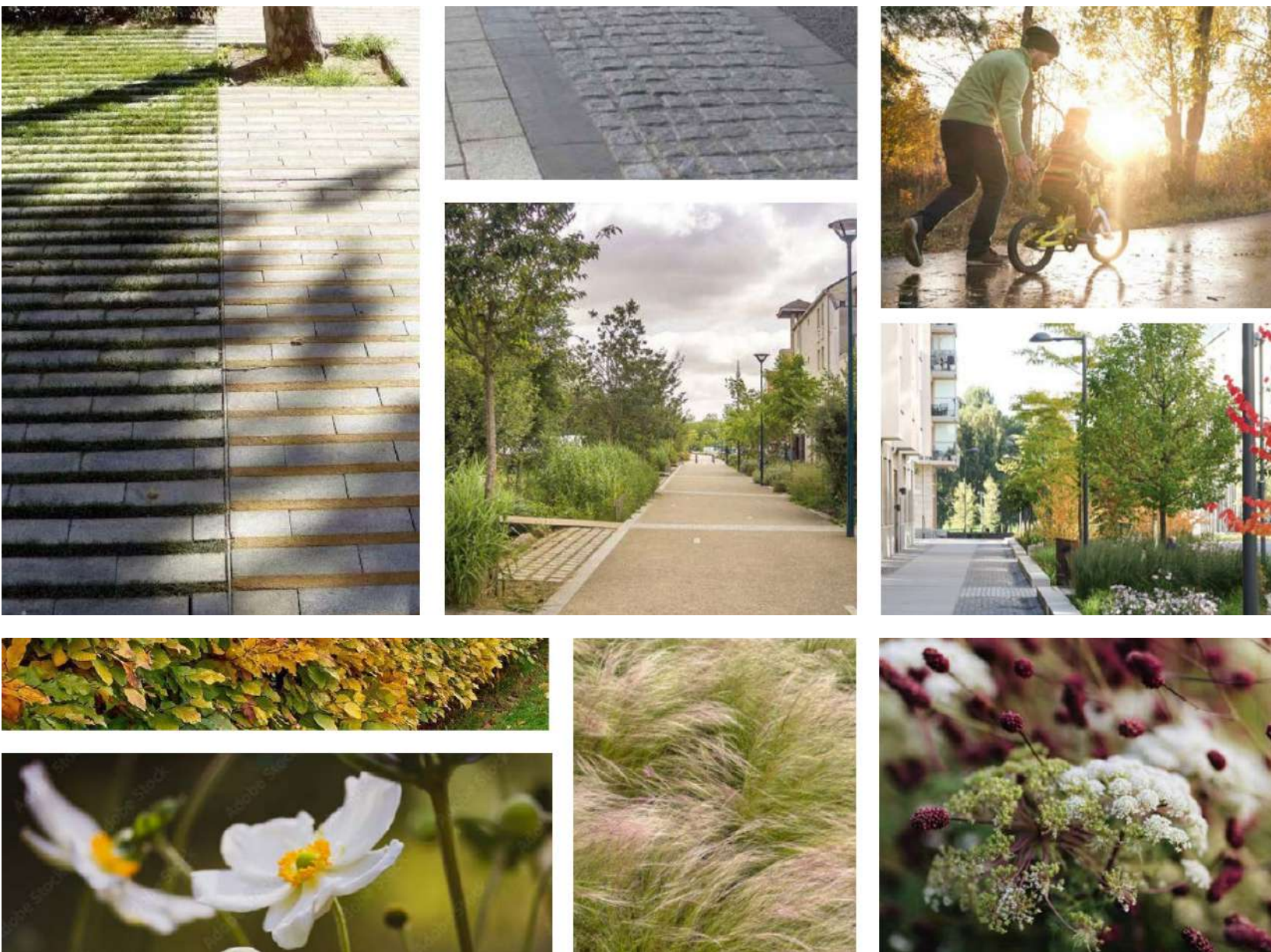
Plan view of typical Mews Street.
